 You invite a co-worker to have dinner with you and your close friends. Over dinner your co-worker makes everyone feel awkward by asking them very personal questions and then dominates the conversation by lecturing each person on how they should live their lives.
 You're hanging out with a group of new friends. One guy, a very fast talker, quickly asks you a question. When you ask him to repeat the question, he responds by saying what he had said really slow and loud (as if he was mentally handicapped). Because of this, everyone in the room is now looking at you.
 Your rich boss invites you to their home. As you're being given "the tour" of the mansion you remark on how beautiful and elegant all the furniture and decorations are. Your boss scoffs and says they're about to redecorate and throw all the furniture away.

### MAKING SENSE OF IT ALL.

QUIZ #1

This quiz assessed how knowledgeable and culturally aware you are to the world around you...

SCORING:

Add up all 15 responses (scores must range from 15-75).

The higher the score, the more culturally aware you are.

Scores above 50 indicate a relatively healthy degree of cultural awareness.

MY SCORE:	
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This quiz assessed how comfortable you'd feel in certain situations...

SCORING: Did you answer "5-Loved and Honored" to any situation?

MY SCORE: YES / NO

This quiz assessed how apprehensive you are when communicating to those from different cultures...

SCORING: Step 1. Add the scores for the following items: 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 10, and 12

Step 2. Add the scores for: 2, 4, 6, 8,11,13, and 14

Step 3. Complete this formula: 42 plus sum of Step 2 minus sum of Step 1.

Scores below 32 indicate little apprehension. Scores above 52 indicate high apprehension. (Scores can range from 14 to 70)

MY SCORE:

This quiz assessed how much you tend to evaluate your culture as superior to others (ethnocentricity).

SCORING: Step 1: Add the scores for: 4, 7, and 9.

Step 2: Add the scores for: 1, 2, 5, 8, 10, 11, 13, 14, 18, 20, 21, and 22.

Step 3: Subtract the sum from Step 1 from 18 (i.e., 18 minus Step 1 sum).

Step 4: Add the results of Step 2 and Step 3. This sum is your score.

Scores above 55 are considered high ethnocentrism.
